Our denomination has an individual congregation do the formal ordination, conferring on the candidate the formal title of "Reverend." It is right and fitting that Jennifer has asked this congregation to ordain her, for she, as a member and former DRE here, has been nurtured, encouraged and supported by all of you as she has gone through this process. Your board of trustees has formally voted to ordain her and is showing their support of her. We ask you all to do likewise.

So, on Sunday, June 1 at 3pm all are invited, encouraged to come to her ordination ceremony, to be there when the congregation is called upon to publicly voice their support and blessings upon her. It is an honor and privilege for any congregation to have this opportunity, and I hope to see many of you there that afternoon.

THE GREEN CORNER:

UU Offers Resources for Sustainable Living

Environmental justice issues have been of concern to UUs for many years.

2001 UUA General Assembly adopted the Statement of Conscience “Responsible Consumption Is Our Moral Imperative.”

In 2006 the delegates to GA adopted the SOC “Threat of Global Warming/Climate Change.”

Many congregations (including UUCGN) have embraced both of these stands in their sustainability, education, and environmental justice projects and advocacy efforts.

- **THE GREEN SANCTUARY PROGRAM** – we received our UUA Green Sanctuary certificate in 2008 and unanimously committed to continue to learn how to create a sustainable future in our lives as individuals as well as a congregation. Since then, we keep sustainability at the conscious level as congregants; we have a team of 8 ambassadors or catalysts who help raise consciousness and model sustainable living within the congregation: Barbara Glasgow (coordinator), Brad Cornell, Brian Doyle, Dennis Lynn, Johanna Parkes, Kathy Ripin, Peggy Bradley, and Philip Myers. The new UUA Green Sanctuary website (updated Oct 2013) is at www.uua.org/environment/sanctuary.
- **THE UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST SERVICE COMMITTEE** – The UUSC (www.uusc.org) understands that there is a global water crisis, which is the product of shifting and competing political and economic interests, depletion from environmental contamination, climate change, over-extraction, and increasing human population. As a human-rights organization, UUSC recognizes the urgent need to respond. Climate justice is a central theme of UUSC’s Environmental Justice work. Rev. Brock Leach (UUSC’s executive consultant for mission, strategy, and innovation) has been our Earth Day speaker for 3 of our 7 Earth Day services: in 2010 he spoke on ethical eating and environmental justice; in 2011 water conservation; and in 2013 UUSC’s eco-village in Haiti.
- **THE UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST UNITED NATIONS OFFICE** – (climate.uu-uno.org) The UU-UNO has a climate change portal that features topical articles, news and resources for climate change / global warming education from authoritative sources -- something like a climate library. It focuses on what you can do to help. Use the “Read Me First” tab on how to find information on the site.
- The UUA goal for **Earth Day 2014** is to deepen our understanding of the impact of our consumption, waste, and resource exploitation patterns on climate change and planetary degradation. We look forward to UUCGN’s 2014 Earth Day service on the last Sunday in June (the 29th), when our speaker, Mr. Roger Williams, will address responsible consumption and sustainable living.
- A 5-week small-group **discussion group** on *Voluntary Simplicity* is currently meeting at UUCGN; the topic is consistent with this year’s theme of responsible consumption. The 10 participants share their responses to the readings (materials from the Northwest Earth Institute), focusing on how over-consumption impacts our lives and relationships.
- Finally, we at UUCGN have benefitted from lots of stimulating programs on sustainable living through both the **Progressive Voices** (our annual lecture series) and our weekly **forum** before the Sunday services.
